THE SLUM IN THE LYCHEE GARDEN NAI WAI #9

Mr. Cheng founded the renowned Hang Heung cake factory and owns property south of Yuen Long village. This included a large lychee garden that was converted into a refugee ghetto.

As early as 2007 ISS-HK settled refugees in this slum, where many dozens have resided over six years. Today 25 refugees are segregated here in squalid illegal structures without toilets.

It is doubtful that legitimate title deeds were collected by ISS-HK considering this is farmland, there is a tree inside a shack and several 'rooms' are offered inside old shipping containers.


