We first visited in May 2013 when several refugee families lived here. Since then several residents have moved away from this remote location, a half-hour walk from a bus stop.

A few years ago about 20 refugees lived on this farmland in several animal sheds partitioned into tiny rooms. There were confrontations with the landlady who often cut the electricity.

One winter several police vans were deployed to this remote hillside to pacify refugees protesting against primitive conditions, high rent and utilities bills and freezing showers.
