

THE SLUM IN THE WHITE PIG FARM

LAM TEI #2

A biblical reference to “whitewashed tombs, which outwardly appear beautiful, but within are full of dead people’s bones and all uncleanness” is hard to resist visiting this refugee ghetto.

Dating back to 2007, when pig farms licenses were bought back by the government, this animal farm went out of business and was redeveloped to settle refugees with rent from ISS-HK.

Today about 20 refugees live in these white structures. If it were not a violation of land use and other ordinances, these premises would pass for village homes - but they are not!

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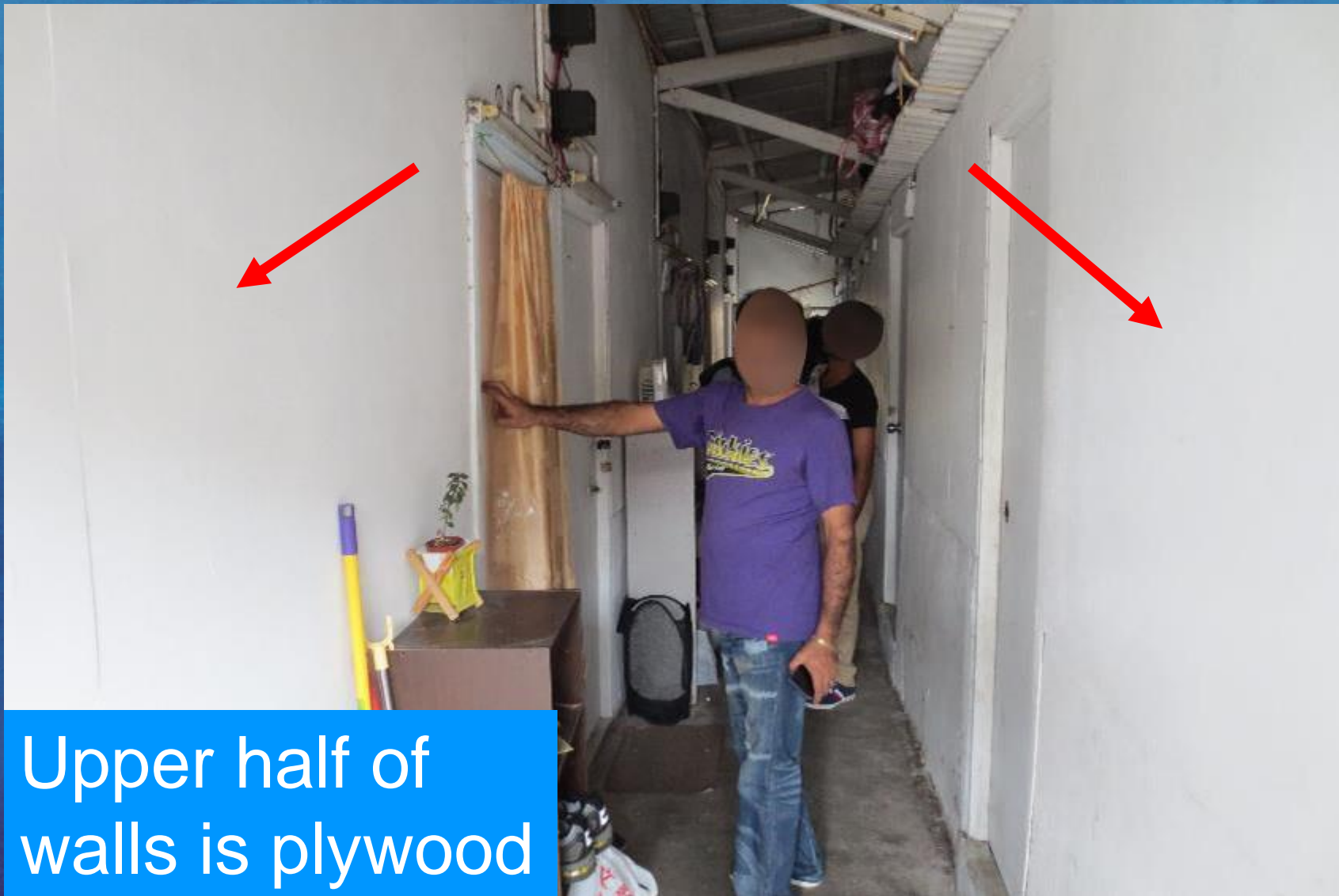

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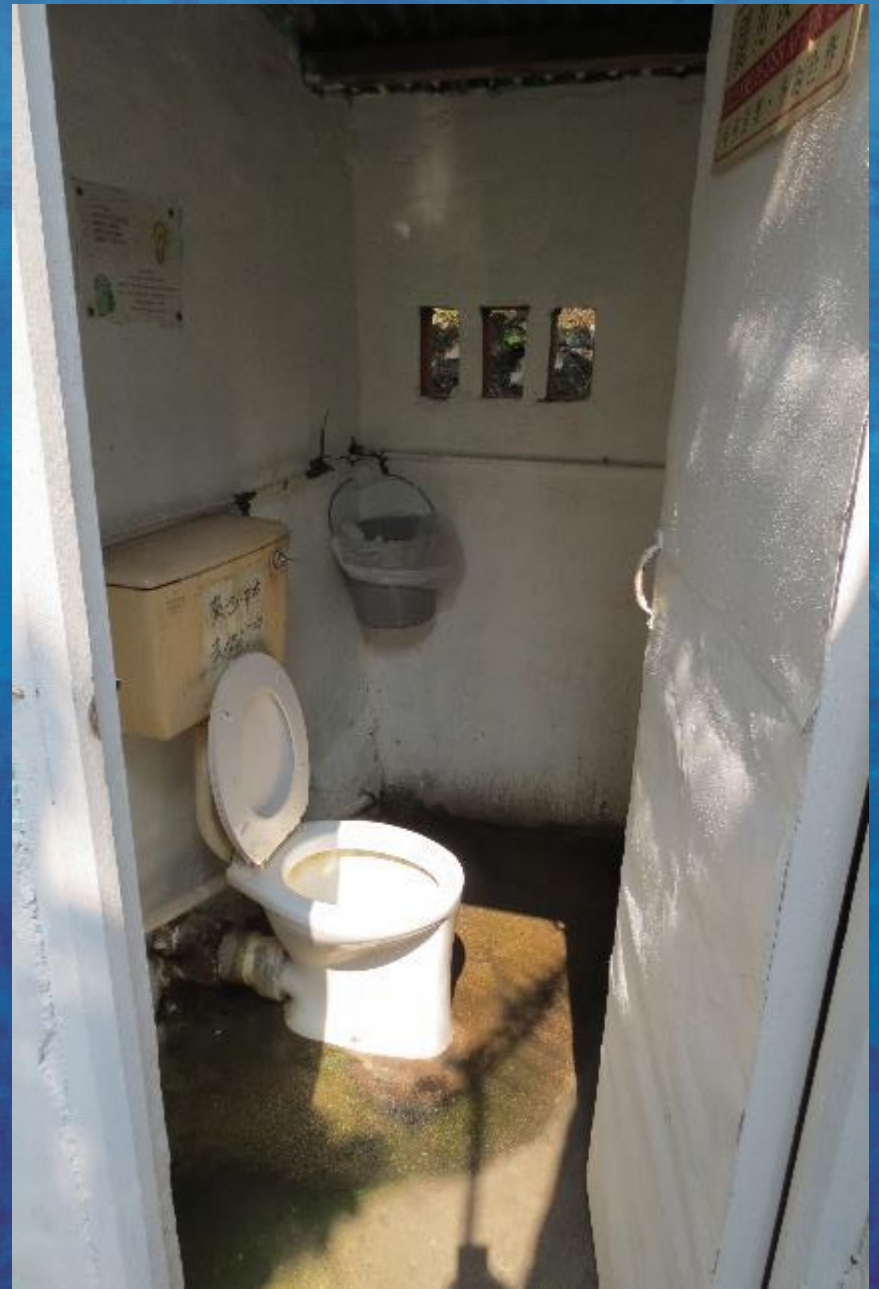


A guesthouse
